A Species to Toy with as a Future Bonsai...

Several years ago I obtained a little shrub from just where, I cannot recall. Something said to me that it was a tropical but it turns out that I was wrong. I brought it out of its winter-time hiding place last spring and found that it had become a nice little tree, about 12 inches tall with furrowed bark. When it burst into bloom late in the summer it had an elaborate flower which can be seen in the picture. This gave me reason to enquire as to what it was. It turned out to be a *Campsis radicans*, commonly called Trumpet Creeper. Further, I was told that it was quite hardy here in Victoria and can be had in several different colours. The second picture shows a yellow flowered version which I picked up at a late season price at a local nursery for under \$10 which included the tax. When planted in the ground it is said to grow rapidly achieving heights of up to 40 ft.

It is obvious that *Campsis* can be trained in the pot, at first it will be pencil thin but when regularly trimmed back, in time, it can become a dandy little bonsai. For now I continue to show the tree with its out-of-scale flower, as a bonsai it will look much better, I feel, without its floral adornment. Give it a try.
