Late Summer Through Fall Fertilizing

At this time of year, focus on preparing your outdoor hardy and semi-hardy bonsai for the hardships of winter. While there is no doubt that well fertilized bonsai have a survival advantage over poorly fertilized trees, the application of 20 N (nitrogen), 20 P (phosphorus), 20 K (potassium) fertilizers should be reduced and high phosphoric acid fertilizers increased during the months of September and October. A 10-52-10 or equivalent fertilizer should be applied once every 10 - 14 days at half strength to fuel the cold hardiness process. Increasing the phosphorous (P) fertilization is explained by Jim Grob, tree physiology researcher for Weyerhaeuser Company and member of the IBC as follows:

All the living cells in a tree have a membrane inside their cell wall. This membrane encloses and maintains the chemistry required to sustain life functions and is composed of phospholipid bi-layer as well as proteins which exist in an essentially fluid state.

During active growth, which is maintained by heavy applications of nitrogen (N), the phospholipid bi-layer consists largely of saturated phospholipids, but during the fall and winter there is a change to the unsaturated phospholipids. Importantly, the change to unsaturated phospholipids maintains the fluid membrane structure during the cooling and freezing. Without this change, saturated phospholipids would otherwise turn crystalline, rupturing the essentially fluid nature of the membranes and destroying or damaging the entire cell.

During the winterizing process, the application of a high phosphorous (P) with an equally high nitrogen (N) and potassium (K) fertilizer may delay the development of unsaturated phospholipids later in the season. This is the type of late season feeding which interferes with the winterization process. It must be mentioned, also, that proteins and enzymes containing nitrogen are created in the fall, and these are directly involved in the cold hardiness development.
