
October - Show & Tell—Fall colours; also convention finds. "Whack & chat" - Hands-on styling sessions for new members.

Viewing Stones from the Jim and Alice Greaves Collection

Pacific Rim Bonsai Collection

Federal Way - Weyerhaeuser Company's Pacific Rim Bonsai Collection will present a special exhibit entitled, "Worlds in Stone - Viewing stones from the Jim and Alice Greaves Collection"

"Worlds in Stone" is an exhibit specially designed to introduce Northwest audiences to the centuries-old Asian practice of appreciating stones for their abstract quality of suggestiveness. Just as we see images in clouds and star patterns, we can see naturally formed and weathered stones large landscape features such as mountains, islands and waterfalls. Other stones may suggest images of flowers, birds, animals, or people, but in every case, the viewer is transported via imagination to a world beyond the stone itself. It is this quality of suggestiveness that differentiates viewing stones from other asthetically appreciated stones such as gems and minerals.

The Greaves Collection of viewing stones has since its inception in 1974 become one of the largest and finest private collections in the US. Mr. Greaves, a professional art conservator, has mounted exhibitions of viewing stones at numerous venues, including Descanso Gardens in LaCanada, CA, the Huntington Library and gardens in San Marino, CA, and the International Mingei Museum in San Diego, CA. "Worlds in Stone" will be the first Northwest showing of this collection.

The Pacific Rim Bonsai Collection is an outdoor museum of living art, located on Weyerhaeuser's campus in Federal Way. Admission is free to the public. September hours: Friday - Wednesday, 10 am until 4 pm, closed Thursday. October hours: Saturday - Wednesday, 11 am until 4 pm, closed Thursday and Friday. 
