Bonsai Aesthetics

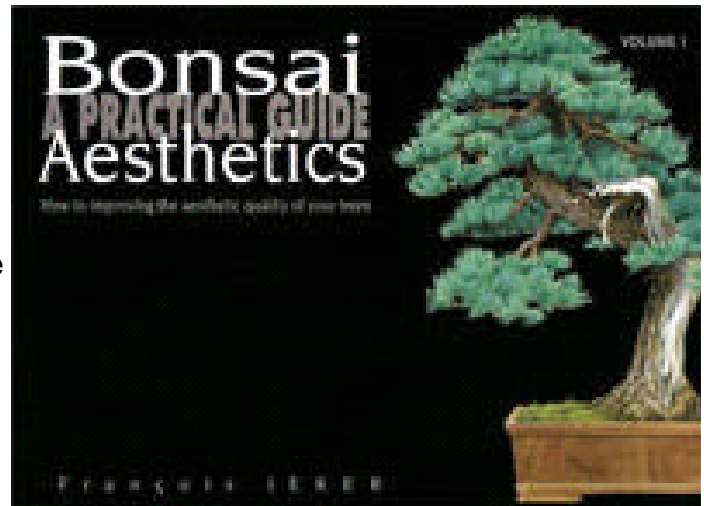
A Practical Guide - Volume 1

He will spend four days in Quebec, before traveling to his two day engagement with the Puget Sound Bonsai Society in Seattle. His final stop for two days will be Victoria. It is planned that he will undertake a demonstration for our membership on Wednesday afternoon, November 26th. He will spend Thursday, before returning to Paris, in a private session. He has been engaged by some members of our club to work with him on their own trees. Both sessions will take place in the classroom of the Glendale Garden formerly known as the Horticultural Centre of the Pacific.

We will provide further information on Francois Jeker and his visit here at our meeting next week.

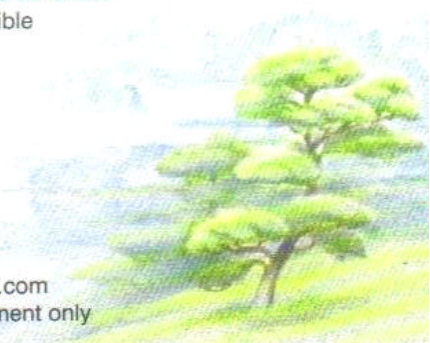
