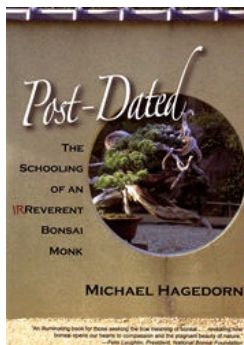
YING– SHI Chinese Scholars' Stone

In searching for trees in Victoria that might be of use when considering locally collected species for bonsai, there has been a handy book on the market called Trees of Greater Victoria: A Heritage . Thanks to our relatively mild climate, over the years many unusual species have settled on Vancouver island—some have become historical treasures; Seedlings can be found and some can be propagated with small cuttings. Unfortunately the book was discontinued by the publisher in 2007 but used copies can, perhaps, be found in used book shops probably in the \$20. Price range.
