On behalf of Laurie and myself, we would like to sincerely thank all the prize donors which helped make the convention raffles and silent auctions a huge success.


At the last club meeting we drew for the three prizes from all the donors who had proved raffles prizes. The winners were:

October Care

From the fall newsletter of the Puget Sound Bonsai Association, we pass along a bit of wisdom on deciduous trees given them recently by their advisor, Boon Manakitivipart.

"When most of the leaves color, pull all of the leaves off to give the weaker, interior buds more light in winter. Increased sunlight and good air circulation will greatly increase the strength with which the buds will open the following spring. For maples, pull the leaves forward with your fingers or tweezers. Beech care differ slightly, use tweezers to pull the leaves backwards to avoid breaking the new buds."
